labioplasty explained

Surgery to reshape female genitalia is becoming increasingly popular, says Sydney cosmetic surgeon **Dr Longin Zurek**. Tara Casey reports.

In recent years there has been an increasing interest in cosmetic surgery of female genitalia. A commonly requested procedure is labioplasty, which reduces the size of the labia minora (inner lips).

In the majority of women, the labia minora are covered by the labia majora (outer lips). Large labia minora may not only cause embarrassment during sexual relations but can often cause physical discomfort and be noticeable when wearing tight clothing.

Additionally, some women seek to correct excessive pigmentation and irregular edges of the labia.

Dr Zurek has completed an extensive training course in female genital surgery in Korea as well as attending numerous international conferences relating to labioplasty procedures. He has further refined techniques discussed at these events based on his own experiences in labioplasty surgery.

Dr Zurek's technique involves reshaping the labia minora without interfering with underlying tissue, allowing precise reduction or modification of the thickness and removal of the uneven edges and pigmentation.

By improving the aesthetic appearance of the female genitalia, labioplasty surgery can also offer the benefit of improved self-image and self-esteem. **acsm**
